2. JOINING AN ERS ASSEMBLY AND GROUP

Active membership is the most beneficial for everyone and by joining the assemblies and groups, members can help set the scientific and educational agenda across all ERS activities. There are 11 Assemblies, specialising in different areas of respiratory medicine, and each divided into groups. To get the most from membership, we encourage members to join one main group and up to two more groups to best suit professional interest areas.

The first choice is a main group where members can exercise voting rights and the second and third choice groups allow members to keep up to date with this professional interest area via mailings that are relevant to this topic. The selection is made when members first login MyERS and can be amended at any time.

11. USING THE RESOURCES OF THE EUROPEAN LUNG FOUNDATION

The European Lung Foundation (ELF) was founded by the European Respiratory Society (ERS) with the aim of bringing together patients and the public with respiratory professionals to positively influence lung health. ELF communicates the latest developments in lung health to people with lung conditions, the public, policy makers and the media. ELF also gives people with lung diseases and the general public the opportunity to influence lung health research and guidelines at the European level.

ELF can work with you in the following ways:

- Providing resources and tools to hold Healthy Lungs for Life events in your country
- Supporting you to set up a patient organisation in your area if there is not currently one
- Working with you to translate our patient materials into your language, or developing materials on topics important to your society

- Working with your national patient organisations in European and international research and developing guidelines for healthcare professionals
- Training and support for patients in your country through the European Patient Ambassador Programme

12. KEY CONTACTS AT ERS AND ELF

Membership Team

The role of the membership department is to administer all ERS membership activities and maintain fruitful relationships with National and Regional Societies that hold international membership contracts with ERS. The department takes care of all ERS representation/stands at non-ERS events and liaises with all ERS departments to collect and prepare promotional material for the ERS Congress and other related conferences.

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Press and Communications Team

The Press and Communications Team coordinates the communication of the work and activities of the ERS to all audiences in the respiratory stakeholder pyramid, including ERS members, respiratory professionals, primary care, the public, patients and media. This encompasses the ERS website, ER Weekly newsletter, social media channels and working with the ELF team on press and public awareness activities.

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12. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQS)

What benefits do I get from joining ERS through my National/Regional Society?

If you join ERS through your National/Regional Society, you will receive the full benefits of being an ERS member, including online access to ERS publications, webcasts, scientific content, and discounts to conferences and events at a reduced annual membership fee of €20.

If I'm already a member of ERS, do I need to cancel my existing membership?

No. Your membership data will be automatically updated. You will still be required to pay the ERS Joint Membership fee of €20. If your existing direct membership with ERS is still valid for more than 6 months, ERS will provide you with refund in the form of a voucher that can be used to pay for either registration at events, print journal subscriptions (*ERJ*, *ERR*, *Breathe*) or to claim back as cash at our annual congress.

If I'm already a member of ERS or have been a member of the ERS in the past, will I need new login details to access ERS material?

No. The login details that you have used for your previous account will remain valid.

Do I have to pay for the new membership?

If you already are a member of ERS, you will be required to pay the ERS Joint Membership fee of €20 and then you will be refunded for remaining paid period of your existing direct membership in the form of a voucher to be used towards various ERS activities.

If you are not yet a member of ERS, the following fees apply:

- Member under 65 years of age: €20/\$25 per year
- Member aged over 65 years of age: €0/€0 per year (*complimentary annual membership*)

If I become an ERS member or renew my membership through my National/Regional society, can I still receive print copies of the journals?

When joining or renewing your ERS membership through your National/Regional society, you will only have online access to ERS publications.

Joint Members can opt to receive print copies of the *European Respiratory Journal*, the *European Respiratory Review* and *Breathe* for additional yearly subscription fees. This subscription can be added to your membership on MyERS.

How will my current membership with the National/Regional society change?

You will have access to ERS membership benefits in addition to unchanged access to your National/Regional's Society membership benefits.

How do I join an ERS assembly or working group?

The ERS community comprises Assemblies and Groups that specialise in specific areas of respiratory medicine and set the scientific and educational agenda across all ERS activities. ERS has 11 Assemblies, divided into groups, which members can choose to become affiliated with.

When you first log in to the [MyERS portal](#), you can join up to 3 groups of interest: the first one is your main group where you can exercise your voting rights and the second and third choice groups allow you to keep up to date with this professional interest area via mailings relevant to this topic.

Is becoming a member of the ERS assemblies compulsory when joining ERS?

Joining the ERS assemblies is not compulsory but it is highly recommended in order for you to fully benefit from your membership and be active in the scientific and educational activities of ERS. By becoming affiliated to an assembly and working groups you become part of the nerve centre of ERS; voting for new leaders, shaping key activities such as the Congress programme and task forces, and being the first to hear about new opportunities and events in your professional interest area.

Can I modify the selection of assemblies and working groups I want to be involved in?

Yes, you can modify your selection through the [MyERS portal](#) at any time.

How can I update my contact details and check my membership status?

You can update your contact details and check your membership whenever needed through the [MyERS portal](#). Alternatively if you experience any issues with the system you can contact the ERS Membership team at members@ersnet.org.

I am under 35 years old and an ERS Silver Member. Do I still have to pay for joint membership?

In countries where a joint agreement exists with a National or Regional respiratory society, the ERS Silver Membership category no longer exists. In these countries, existing active

members of ERS under the age of 35 can wait for their membership to expire before renewing through the National/Regional society. New ERS members below the age of 35 will be requested to pay the full Joint Membership fee of €20.

If your national/regional society is not yet part of the joint agreement with ERS, you can still join ERS directly. ERS offers different membership categories based on age, country of residence and professional activity. Please complete the online application process through the [MyERS portal](#).

I do not have an email address. Can I still take advantage of the joint membership?

To take full advantage of the benefits the joint membership scheme provides, a working email address is required. We therefore strongly encourage you to set up an email account to fully benefit from ERS membership.

I am not a member of the National/Regional society in my country/region of residence; can I still be a member of ERS?

Yes you can join the ERS directly as a direct member through the [MyERS portal](#) where you can complete the application process through the [MyERS portal](#).

If your national/regional society is not yet part of the joint agreement with ERS, you can still join ERS directly.

ERS offers different membership categories based on age, country of residence and professional activity. Please complete the online application process through the [MyERS portal](#).

How can I renew my membership with the ERS as a direct member?

To become a member of the ERS or renew your membership as a direct member, please complete the online application process through the [MyERS portal](#).
